It's a model of living that works: There are 12 notfor-profit Abbeyfield Houses around New Zealand (like this one in Queenstown), and 850 in 16 countries. The guiding principle is simple; to assist older people to achieve a fulfilling way of life.

The old concept of community living and genuine caring is behind this local housing project for the elderly, and it needs your support.


