Age Concern Horowhenua offers numerous services to anyone 65 and over but one that is perhaps least known is the Accredited Visiting Service (AVS).

"We know there are people who could really use this service," said Finance administrator and AVS coordinator Lynn Pettigrew. "This really is a win, win service. We match up a volunteer to visit one of our people for an hour each week." Visitors can be anyone over 18 years old.

Activities co ordinator for Age Concern Horowhenua, Robynne Merwood would like to see more volunteers to cover Shannon and Foxton. "We are so lucky to have excellent volunteers available in Levin and would welcome more people to visit," she said.

After a Police check, applicants are given on-going training before they are assigned. "We take lots of care matching our people up," Lynn said. "We have men and woman from all walks of life. I have seen many very genuine friendships formed through the years."
