Life after a stroke can be debilitating, frustrating, stressful and depressing. Stroke is New Zealand's third biggest killer and a leading cause of major disability.

The Kapiti Stroke Group was formed in 1990 so survivors, their families and carers could get together on a regular basis to share camaraderie and have fun. They meet
