CAMEO or Come And Meet Each Other (Waikanae Cameo Incorporated Society) was founded by Waikanae woman Alison Vautier in 2002. Alison wanted to create a centre where people could have a seat and a cuppa for free. A welcome, safe place to wait for an appointment, a train, or just to rest.

The Cameo Pop In Centre, located in Waikanae's Mahara Place, is open five days a week and manned entirely by volunteers. The doors are open from 10 am until 3pm Monday to Friday - excluding most pubic holidays and over

Christmas. Cameo is open right through January with reduced hours of 11.00 am to 2.00 pm.

On Tuesday mornings from 10am until 12pm a Justice of the Peace is in residence offering his or her services. Board games and books are always available, and a room at the back of the shop can be used for small groups to meet. The jug is always on for a cuppa. There are no fees but donations are appreciated or an


