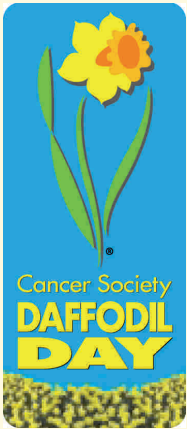


# Caring For Our Community
